EVENT DESCRIPTION

The District IV Ultra Leadership Lab is a three-day and two-night leadership training for District IV 4-H members. It will be an opportunity for the youth to build their leadership skills, gain information they can take back to their county clubs to enhance their programs, and have fun meeting and interacting with other youth across our district.

OFFICER INSTALLATION

Parents are welcome to attend the 2023-2024 District Council Officer Installation that will be held on Wednesday, at 10:00 a.m. in the Hope Dorm.

THEME DAYS

Monday: Pick a decade and dress to reflect it! i.e. the 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s, etc.

Tuesday: Dress to reflect your future career!

Wednesday: Vintage 4-H T-Shirt Day! Find a vintage 4-H t-shirt from a friend or family or wear one of your own 4-H Club's t-shirt. You can accessorize it with a 4-H cap, jewelry, etc.



AGE REQUIREMENT

Members must be at least in the 9th grade and not more than 12th grade by September 1 of the 2023-2024 4-H year and at least 14 years old as of the date of the camp.

COST

\$150.00 (transferable, but non-refundable), which covers lodging and meals (Day 1 – Dinner, Day 2 - Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner, Day 3 – Breakfast). For Camp Store purchases you can use cash, credit and debit cards as well as Apple Pay. Also, the concession trailer at The Patio will be open during limited hours in the afternoon and evening.

REGISTRATION

4-H members and Agents must register on 4H Online between May 17, 2023 – May 31, 2023. No late registrations will be accepted.

DRESS CODE

Dress for the camp is casual, but neat and that follows the 4-H dress code. Athletic or tennis type shoes are preferred. Water or lake shoes are also recommended.

Bring clothes and shoes appropriate for active sports, swimsuits, water shoes, outdoor recreation, and a dance. Tennis or athletic shoes are required for the Ropes Activity. Incoming and Outgoing District Council Officers will need to bring a nice outfit appropriate for the Officer Installation.

Items **NOT** allowed – tops with spaghetti straps, halter type tops, shirts that reveal the bare midriff, excessively loose-fitting pants/jeans, short shorts or skirts, clothing advertising referencing alcohol, drugs, violence or having a sexual content. See-through or muscle shirts are not appropriate for boys at camp. Two-piece swimsuits are **NOT** allowed and girls must wear a t-shirt over their one-piece swimsuit.

WHAT TO BRING

All participates (youth and Agents) will be housed in dorm facilities.

The following items are needed:

Pillow, sheets, blanket and/or sleeping bag, towels, washcloths, toiletries, reusable drink bottles, bug spray, sunscreen, and a flashlight.

Card or board games, snacks, and money for camp store for snacks or souvenirs.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Please do not bring valuable electronic equipment. Do not bring water guns, water sling shots, shaving cream (unless for personal use), video games, or fireworks.

CELL PHONES

Campers will be asked to leave their cell phones in their dorm rooms during the day and evening activities.

CODE OF CONDUCT

4-H members should have completed a "Consequences of Behavior" and "Code of Conduct" form when enrolling in 4H Online for the 2023-2024 4-H year. These documents will be followed during the Ultra Leadership Lab.
