

Healthy Lifestyles Invitational Contest Memo

Date: Friday, April 5, 2024 and Saturday, April 6, 2024

Location: Texas A&M University-Commerce

Rayburn Student Center 2200 Campbell Street Commerce, Texas 75428

Contest: At the contestant's convenience anytime between 10:00 a.m.

and 1:00 p.m.

Registration. Each participating member is required to register on 4-HOnline and pay the district \$12.00 contest registration fee. Registration will begin on March 6, 2024 and close at midnight March 20, 2024. No late entries will be accepted.

Participation. Contestants must be active 4-H members enrolled in a Texas 4-H and Youth Development County program in District IV. Contestants must also be academically eligible (according to UIL rules) to compete on the day of the contest. A contestant may compete as an individual or as a member of a team.

Age. Age divisions are determined by a participant's grade as of September 1st of the current 4-H year. Age divisions for this contest are:

- Junior (3rd, 4th, & 5th grades)
- Intermediate (6th, 7th, & 8th grades)
- Senior (9th, 10th, 11th, & 12th grades)

Entries per County. Each county may enter unlimited individuals per age division listed above. This is not a state qualifying contest.

Suggested materials to bring for the contest: Clipboard, blank paper, and pencils. No calculators allowed.

This contest is designed to be an introduction to the Healthy Lifestyles Invitational offered at State Round-Up. There are some notable differences in the contest including, number of classes judged team participation, and group presentation. Contest Format

Judging

- Each participant works individually to place/rank FOUR classes, each of which consists of a scenario and four options related to a healthy lifestyle topic. For each class, the individual participant will rank the four options based on the given situation. Some classes may also include a multiple choice and/or true/false quiz. Six minutes are allowed for each class, with one minute in between classes to allow for rotation to the next class. In Identification Classes, participants will be provided a photo of or an actual item which they must correctly identify to earn points.
- Participants will use the Universal Form A Scantron to indicate class placings. The scantron will be provided for each contestant. Click here for an example of the scantron <u>Universal Form A Scantron</u>.
 Please make sure the contestant is familiar with how to use this scantron.
- Each of the four classes is worth 50 points.
- The four classes will provide a situation on various healthy lifestyles topics, with class topics being:
 - 1. Food Safety
 - 2. Healthy Snacking
 - 3. Mental Health Wellness
 - 4. Cooking Identification

Awards. 1st through 5th place individual awards in each age division will be presented.
