Entry Fee: \$15.00

Participation. Contestants must be active 4-H members enrolled in a Texas 4-H and Youth Development County program in District IV. Contestants must also be academically eligible (according to UIL rules) to compete on the day of the contest.

Age. Age divisions are determined by a participant's grade as of September 1st of the current 4-H year. Age divisions for this contest are:

- Junior (3rd, 4th, & 5th grades)
- Intermediate (6th, 7th, & 8th grades)
- Senior (9th, 10th, 11th, & 12th grades)

Entries per County. Each county may enter one Record Book per age division per category.

State Record Book Qualifiers. Senior age division youth placing 1st Place in each category will advance to the State Record Book Judging Contest.

Awards. 1st through 5th place individual awards will be given.
