Registration. Each participating member is required to register on 4-H Online (https://texas.4honline.com) and pay the \$15.00 registration fee. Registration will open on March 4, 2026 and close at midnight on March 18, 2026. Paperwork is due at the time of registration (see Paperwork Requirements section below).

Participation. Contestants must be active 4-H members enrolled in a Texas 4-H and Youth Development County program in District IV. Contestants must also be academically eligible (according to UIL rules) to compete on the day of the contest.

All garments/ensembles to be judged must have been purchased (renting a garment is not allowed in the buying division) or constructed during participation in a 4-H Fashion & Interior Design project between June 2025, and the district contest in the 2025-2026 4-H year.

Age. Age divisions are determined by a participant's grade as of September 1st of the current 4-H year. Age divisions for this contest are:

- Junior (3rd, 4th, & 5th grades)
- Intermediate (6th, 7th, & 8th grades)
- Senior (9th, 10th, 11th, & 12th grades)

Academic Eligibility. According to the Texas Education Code, a 4-H member must be deemed "eligible" to compete in an event that takes place on a weekday or weekend.

All 4-H youth, including youth in public, private, and/or home school must adhere to the following guidelines regarding extracurricular activities and academic eligibility:

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- Complete a "Declaration of Eligibility Form"
 OR
- Name of 4-H member must appear on a list of eligible students to participate in a specific extracurricular activity signed by the school principal or designee.
- Contact your local county extension office for the process used by YOUR county.

If a 4-H member is ineligible for a 4-H competitive event, the agent must notify the 4-H member, his/her parents, and the district office, by letter/email, of this situation. If the parent has any questions, he/she should be referred to the school administrator.

Eligibility forms will be returned to and remain in the county offices

Entries per county. Each county may enter one individual per age division per category. The first-place senior individual in each category will qualify for state.

Awards. 1st through 5th place individual awards in each age category will be presented.

4-H FASHION SHOW INTERVIEW PROCEDURE

1. Introduction/Presentation

Each contestant will start by introducing themselves and model their garment for the judges. Presentation times to the judges will be as follows:

- Seniors 5 Minutes
- Intermediates 4 Minutes
- Juniors 3 Minutes

During the presentation, the participants need to describe their project activities, outfit selection, construction or buying skills, and their knowledge of fiber and fabrics. Prior to competing the participant should review the contest score sheet to see the areas that will be judged.

2. Question and Answer

Judges will have the opportunity to ask each participant questions from the list of contest questions as well as questions related directly to the participant's garment or project experiences.

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BUYING

- 1. All garments worn (garments that are visible i.e., blouse under jacket or vest) during the interview process must be included in the buying worksheet.
- 2. In Buying, first place winners may enter the same category in which they have previously been awarded a first-place entry at State, unless they have competed at the National Fashion Revue. See related rules in the 2026 4-H Roundup guide.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE BUYING CATEGORIES	
Dressy	Garments worn to dressy activities such as church, banquets, luncheons, and 4-H interviews. Examples are children's suits and dressy dresses. The original material must be fabric and not from recycled items.
Everyday Living	Includes casual sportswear, weekend wear, clothing for school, casual after-school events, or hanging out with friends.
Fantastic Fashion under \$25	This category encourages 4-H members to explore alternative shopping options by purchasing outfits from garage sales, consignment stores, thrift shops (like Goodwill or Salvation Army), or other resale venues. The goal is to demonstrate smart consumer skills while creating a complete, stylish look. Receipts are required for all visible items during the interview—except shoes, including accessories and jewelry. Handwritten receipts are acceptable for garage sale purchases.
Special Interest	This category highlights outfits that support a participant's specific hobby, sport, or lifestyle needs such as equestrian gear, dancewear, hiking apparel, or rock-climbing clothing. Entries should demonstrate the ability to make smart purchasing decisions for specialized clothing that must be functional, durable, and appropriate for the activity.

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SENIOR BUYING CATEGORIES					
Business/Interview Attire	This category features outfits appropriate for job interviews, scholarship interviews, job fairs, or other professional settings.				
	Professional – A polished, conservative look such as a business suit, blazer with dress slacks or skirt, or a coordinated pantsuit.				
	2. Business Casual – A more relaxed yet neat and professional style, including collared shirts, sweaters, khakis or slacks, modest dresses or skirts, and clean dress or casual shoes.				
Semi-formal to Formal	Garments in this category are designed for semi-formal or formal occasions and must be constructed from appropriate fabrics for such events.				
	 Semi-Formal attire is stylish and polished, but less formal than black-tie. Women: midi or maxi dresses, wrap dresses, cocktail dresses, pantsuits, or jumpsuits. 				
	Men: slacks with a blaze, two-piece suit (with or without a tie), and accessories like pocket squares or dress watches.				
	Formal attire is suitable for events such as prom, evening weddings, or gala parties. • Women: floor-length gowns, knee-length cocktail dresses, or a classic little black dress.

CONSTRUCTION

1. Garments may be constructed by sewing, knitting, or crocheting. Accessories may be purchased.

- 2. All garments worn (garments that are visible i.e., blouse under jacket or vest) during the interview process must be constructed. Close-fitting legwear, tights, and pantyhose do not need to be constructed.
- 3. In Construction, first place winners may enter the same category in which they have previously been awarded a first–place entry at State, unless they have competed at the National Fashion Revue. See related rules in the 2026 4-H Roundup guide.

JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE CONSTRUCTION CATEGORIES	
Everyday Living	This category features garments designed for daily activities and relaxed settings. Whether it's casual sportswear, weekend outfits, sleepwear, or clothes for school and social hangouts, participants create practical, comfortable, and stylish looks suited for everyday life. The focus is on functionality, quality construction, and appropriate fabric choices that reflect the wearer's lifestyle and personality.
Re-Fashion	This category is an eco-friendly category where participants upcycle old or damaged textiles into entirely new garments. Using creativity and sewing skills, youth transform items like curtains or t-shirts into

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	fresh, fashionable pieces— beyond simple alterations—to keep materials out of landfills.			
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Dressy	Garments worn to dressy activities such as church, banquets, luncheons, and 4-H interviews. Examples are children's suits and dressy dresses. The original material must be fabric and not from recycled items.			
Theatre/Costume	This category showcases garments created for stage productions, cosplay, or themed events. Costumes may be fully constructed from fabric or creatively built on existing clothing. Designs often feature imaginative concepts, innovative materials, and bold details with a balance between theatrical flair and wearability.

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Semi-formal to Formal	Garments in this category are designed for semi- formal or formal occasions and must be constructed from appropriate fabrics for such events.

UPCYCLE YOUR STYLE

- 1. A majority of the outfit should be upcycled (for example, a pair of denim jacket and jeans with embroidery work paired with a non-upcycled shirt, a tie dyed dress with a vest or a hand painted jacket with a sweater). The focal point of the outfit should be the upcycled item.
- 2. Garment may be new or used, purchased from a store, resale shop, or already owned.
- 3. Alterations should focus on decorative or creative enhancements rather than major structural reconstruction.

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4. In Upcycle Your Style, first place winners may enter the same category in which they have previously been awarded a first-place entry at State, unless they have competed at the National Fashion Revue. JUNIOR/INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR UPCYCLE YOUR STYLE	
	4-H members will take a new or used garment and enhance it through creative decoration or embellishment to provide additional value and personal flair. The purpose of this category is to encourage youth to practice sustainable fashion habits by giving new life to clothing through thoughtful design choices. Participants may add trims, appliqués, patches, paint, embroidery, dye techniques, or other decorative details to upgrade and personalize a garment. The finished product should reflect the participant's creativity, style, and decision-making skills, while demonstrating how small changes can transform and extend the life of a clothing item.

Texas Natural Fibers

- 1. All garments worn (garments that are visible i.e., blouse under jacket or vest) during
 - the interview process must be included in the Texas Natural Fiber worksheet.
- 2. Garments may be constructed by the participant or purchased, provided they prominently feature one or more Texas-grown fibers.
- 3. Fiber content may include cotton, wool, mohair, or blended fabrics containing these materials.
- 4. Participants must be able to identify the fiber content and explain its Texas connection during the judging interview.

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5. In Texas Natural Fiber, first place winners may enter the same category in which they have previously been awarded a first- place entry at State, unless they have competed at the National Fashion Revue. See related rules in the 2026 4-H Roundup guide.

SENIOR TEXAS NATURAL FIBER				
Texas Natural Fiber	The Texas Fiber category is designed to promote awareness and appreciation of Texas-grown natural fibers such as cotton, wool, and mohair. Participants will showcase garments that celebrate the state's fiber industry, highlighting the importance of local agriculture in the fashion and textile industries. Texas leads the nation in cotton production and is a significant producer of wool and mohair. This category educates youth about the state's agricultural economy and encourages mindful consumerism and fiber advocacy through fashion.			
Cotton	Each garment entered must contain a minimum of 60% cotton.			
Wool/Mohair	 Each garment entered must contain a minimum of: 60% wool and 40% other fiber. 60% mohair and 40% other fiber. 60% blend of the two fibers and 40% other fiber. 100% wool/mohair blend is also acceptable.

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ADDITIONAL DISTRICT RULES.

- No additional garments may be carried. All garments must be worn during the competition.
- However, props can be carried for the Fashion Show only (i.e. show stick, tennis racket, golf club, corsage, teddy bear). No props will be allowed during the judging process.
- Garments not fitting category description will be judged accordingly.
- Promote Texas Fibers is a class just like construction or buying, but only open to senior members. A contestant may choose to only enter the Promote Texas Fibers Contest or both the Promote Texas Fibers Contest and the appropriate Construction or Buying division. A Promote Texas Fibers contestant may be judged twice.
- Junior contestants are allowed to construct one complete outfit or one piece of an outfit. Judges will ask Junior contestants what part of their outfit they made.
- Intermediate and Senior contestants must construct all parts of their outfit. Entries not meeting these requirements will be judged and scored accordingly.
- A participant receives a penalty of 5 or more points for not following all Fashion Show requirements, which includes not completing all forms or illegible or incorrect forms.

If ties should occur, the ties will be broken using the state tie-breaking rules.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Parents will not be allowed in the holding or judging areas during the judging process. An area will be available for parents to wait.
- Counties may enter one entry from each of the three age groups in each category of each division.
- The only entry forms that are acceptable are those found on this page. DO NOT reformat any of the Word or Adobe Documents to accommodate the amount of information you want to place on your entry.

Participants with Disabilities. Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the District Extension Office or Denita Young at djyoung@ag.tamu.edu or note when registering on 4-H Online, at least 2 weeks before the competition to request such needs.

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Paperwork Requirements. Fashion Show forms must be scanned and uploaded on 4-H Online by the registration deadline. The CEA signature on the form is not required for district. Approval of 4-H Online registration will constitute CEA approval of the member's forms. Contestants who do not upload the required forms on 4-H Online at the time of entry will be disqualified.
